One in five Australians will experience a mental illness in the next 12 months, almost 50% of us in our lifetimes. However less than one in five of us seek help when we are stressed or down.

To raise our awareness of mental health and resources available Havilah is having a Mental Health Awareness Day.

There will be take away resources available on Wednesday 2nd December at Raglan, this will be in the main foyer between 10.30 and 12 midday.

The resident of the Raglan House celebrated the 2015 Melbourne Cup with Family, Friends and the Residents of the Independent community.


Residents enjoyed the Fashions on the field, Games, Quizzes, Cup Sweeps, giveaway and more.

This is for the reason of safety, Havilah and Emergency Personnel need to be able to identify all the soles is in the Building in the event of an Emergency or Evacuation. Havilah request all residents to advise their visitors and guests of the new procedure.



The Visitors Sign in Book is located in the Foyer of the Main Entrance to Raglan House. Please note also that an area is to be added to both books to record food either you or your visitors bring in. This in no way limits family bringing in special treats but does provide a record for us in the event of a salmonella outbreak or the like.

WHAT TO DO WHEN THE FIRE ALARM SOUNDS

Residents and Visitors should remain where they are and wait for staff to instruct you on evacuation. If you can see the fire you should move away from the immediate area and wait for instruction from staff. If the fire is in your room you should leave the room and close the door behind you.

Havilah is a very safe facility and has many measures in place to stop the spread of fire and smoke and to provide for safe evacuation in the case of a fire – this includes fire and smoke compartments, and sprinklers and smoke alarms.

There is a maximum of 6 resident rooms in each smoke/fire compartment and therefore should evacuation be required in the first instance it would only be for residents in the affected compartment.

The fire alarm automatically alarms at the fire station and the Brigade is here within minutes. Once the alarm has sounded the Brigade will attend even for false alarms. From the fire panel at the front of the building and on our staff pagers we can see which alarm has been actioned and therefore we immediately know the area to check.

When the Fire Alarm sounds RESIDENTS WILL BE KEPT INFORMED VIA STAFF AND THROUGH THE PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM.

Havilah is a non smoking site which adds to the safety of residents and staff.


If you report an issue to any staff member they will fill out a form on your behalf.

CODEWORD NO. 15




Each letter in this puzzle is represented by a number 1-26.




