**Accreditation:** Re-accreditation assessment at the Harkness site happened over two days on the 12th and 13th of February. This was unannounced and a first for Havilah being a new requirement of government for all re-accreditation assessments from July 2018. The Audit Report indicates that all 44 outcomes were met. Most importantly residents said that they are very happy and satisfied. Staff on duty responded brilliantly, indicating that they know Havilah's policies and practices in place to provide quality and safe services for each resident, can carry out their role well and very importantly that they know the residents they are caring for. Residents, families and staff indicated that they knew where to go to for assistance and that Havilah was responsive to any concerns they raised.

Fair to say this was a very robust process as it should be. In an environment where many facilities are not meeting the accreditation outcomes we were extremely pleased to receive so much positive feedback from the assessors and from our residents and families.

24 New Residential Aged Care Places for Havilah The Hon Ken Wyatt AM, MP, Minister for Senior Australians and Aged Care has advised that Havilah's application under the Aged Care Approvals Round (ACAR) 2018-2019 has been successful.

In making the announcement Minister Wyatt said that this year's ACAR was highly competitive with rigorous assessment based on the applicant's ability to deliver care, and management experience and expertise. Demand was strong with only one third of places applied for granted. A new facility adjacent to Heath House will be constructed to accommodated these places. Havilah has 4 years to bring the places into operation. When added to the planned construction of 24 places at Havilah on Palmerston due to commence later this year this will mean a further 48 residential aged care places for Central Goldfields Shire by 2023. With the percentage of population over 70 years of age in Central Goldfields Shire growing at twice the Victorian average this announcement is very important for the local community.

#### **HAVILAH ON PALMERSTON STAGE 2**

We are "not so patiently" waiting for advice from Council so that the next step in the town planning process can commence. Three months have already passed since the Planning Application was lodged in late November. There has been some

information exchange between the Council and Havilah Planners during that time and hopefully we will soon be able to engage with our neighbours and the general community in relation to the project.

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### Embracing Technology: Improving the lives of over 60's:

Technology is increasingly making our lives easier: food delivered to your door at the touch of a button, movies on demand day or night, and of course, never having to read a map when driving is pretty nifty. But government statistics show that 74 per cent of over 70s are "digitally disengaged" and approximately 34 per cent of Australians aged 50 years and over (about 2.7 million people) had either low digital literacy levels or did not use digital devices or the internet.

However, according to positive ageing advocate, author and director of Global Ageing Network, Marcus Riley, the emerging generation of older people are becoming increasingly *engaged* with technology and has outlined a number of ways that technology can help "successful ageing".

Riley believes that although they might have found it difficult at first, older people are actively using technology, with 85 per cent of people aged 65 years and older using the internet at least once per day.

"The once resistant, older generations are engaging with technology to not only help them maintain their quality of life, but in some instances, even improve it," he said.

"An interesting thing to note is that older generations are even influencing the development of technology as it adapts to meet the demands of our ageing population."





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#### **BOOK REVIEW**



You know the old saying – home is where the heart is – and for many of us, the saying rings true. When called upon, we can think of a place that makes us feel warm and safe, one that houses happy memories and allows us to retreat back to the whimsy, warmth and wonder of our child-hood.

For Ellen and Aidan, their grandmother's stone cottage in West Cork was always such a place. Long-

neglected, the property is in need of some TLC, and, after returning home from Australia, Ellen is eager to restore the property to its former glory. She enlists the help of her dear friend, Colette Barry, who also happens to be one of Ireland's top interior designers.

Aidan, however, is already begrudging the building work on the house he has actively avoided for almost 20 years now. What Ellen sees as a precious house

brimming with happy memories of their bygone child-hood summer retreats, Aidan sees as a painful reminder of what has been lost. To make matters worse, Colette seems to be complicating everything, and Aidan is confused about his feelings towards her. Colette too, has her own personal heartaches to overcome, and it isn't long before the two realise that maybe, just like the old, run down cottage, they too deserve a second chance.

An enchanting novel about starting over, *The House of Second Chances* transports readers from coastal Australia to the rugged emerald beauty of Ireland, as it poignantly explores memories and emotions and the ways in which people, like houses, can be abandoned and restored. Significantly, the stone cottage in West Cork becomes a character of its own, challenging Ellen, Aidan, and Colette to overcome and reflect on their own personal heartaches and fears. Seeing each character transform with the cottage's refurbishment is a magical experience. A beautiful metaphor, and one that is not at all forced or cliche – a testament to Campion's ability to write straight from the heart with a voice so genuine and intimate, it's as if you are listening to an old friend.



The football season is once again just around the corner with the 2019 season kicking off with the first round of matches on 21st March.



## In The Kitchen Condensed milk Cheesecake Slice.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 250g Arnott's Nice biscuits
- 125g butter,
- melted 500g cream cheese, at room temperature
- 397g can sweetened condensed milk 2
- tablespoons lemon juice
- 2 Coles Australian Free Range Eggs
- 1 1/2 cups frozen mixed berries



#### **METHOD:**

- Step 1 Preheat oven to 150C. Grease and line base and 2 long sides of a 20cm x 30cm lamington pan with baking paper, allowing the sides to overhang.
- Step 2 Process biscuits in a food processor until finely crushed. Add the butter and process until
  well combined. Spoon biscuit mixture into prepared pan. Use the base of a flat-bottomed glass to
  spread and press over the base. Place in fridge for 30 mins to chill.
- Step 3 Meanwhile, process the cream cheese in a food processor until smooth. Add the condensed milk and lemon juice and process until smooth. Add the eggs. Process until well combined.
- Step 4 Sprinkle half the berries over the base. Pour over the cream cheese mixture and smooth the surface. Sprinkle with remaining berries. Bake for 30 mins or until just set. Turn off oven. Cool in oven, with door ajar, for 1 hour. Place in the fridge for 2 hours to chill. Cut into squares to serve

"Where's that squirrel? I sent him off an hour ago to bring me another panther."


