All Tickets have been sold this year. A big Thank you to Raeleen for another year of organising this fundraiser and to all of our supporters who bought and sold tickets.




Retirement Living Unit residents who are taking advantage of Raglan House kitchen take a way meal service, waiting with social distancing but still having a chat amongst one another.

BOOK REVIEW



Welcome to the Banksia Bay Beach Shack, where first love is found and last chances are taken. Mysteries, secrets, lies. What is hiding, or being hidden, in the small sleepy seaside town of Banksia Bay? After her grandmother, Lillian, passed away, journalist Laura Prescott discovered a series of intriguing mementos left behind. A photograph, a pendant, a postcard. They make Laura question what she knew about her grandmother. She makes the decision to go back to Banksia Bay to learn the truth about Lillian's past. But when she arrives, Laura finds a community where everyone seems to be hiding something.

Virginia is the owner of the iconic Beach Shack café. She has kept her past and all its secrets buried for sixty years. As Laura slowly uncovers the tragic fragments of one summer so long ago, Virginia must decide whether to hold on to her secrets or set the truth free. And what is the price of telling the truth?

Interspersed throughout the story of Laura is the story of Young Gigi and Lily. Coming from different worlds, they make unlikely friends, but forge an unbreakable bond – the 'Sisters of Summer'. But in 1961, a chain of events is set off that reaches far into the future. One lie told. One lie to set someone free. One lie that changes the course of so many lives.

Sweet as! The Polly Waffle is finally returning – because of coronavirus

Plans to revive the old-school treat were announced last year, but production is now going into overdrive thanks to COVID-19.

The family-owned South Australian chocolate company Robert Menz has scored \$1 million in federal funding to establish a Polly Waffle production line – creating 38 much-needed new jobs.

Originally invented in Melbourne in 1947, the marsh-mallow-filled, chocolate-coated wafer tube was eventually acquired by Nestlé in 1988, hitting its

peak in the 1990s before it was axed in 2009. But in 2019, Robert Menz – the same company that brought back the Violet Crumble (a wise decisions) – got its hands on the recipe.

The iconic choccie will now be back on shelves in early 2021 – just in time for me to hopefully have recovered from all the quarantine comfort food.



Family beef and mushroom pie

Ingredients:

- I sheet frozen short crust pastry, partially thawed.
- I sheet frozen puff pastry, partially thawed.
- I tablespoon extra virgin olive oil.
- 2 brown onions thinly sliced.
- 200g thinly sliced mushrooms.
- 3 garlic cloves crushed.
- I tablespoon fresh thyme leaves.
- 500g beef mince.
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste.
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce.
- I/3 cup gravy powder.
- I egg, beaten lightly.
- Mashed potato to serve.
- Steamed peas to serve.

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan forced. Grease a 3cm deep, 20cm round (base) pie dish. Line base and side of dish with shortcrust pastry, trimming to fit. Place dish on a baking tray. Line dish with baking paper, Fill with pie weights or uncooked rice. Blind-bake for 10 to 12 minutes. Remove paper and weights. Bake for a further 10 to 12 minutes or until edge is light golden.
- · Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium to high-

heat. Add onion. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until softened. Add mushroom, garlic and thyme. Cook stirring, for 5 minutes or until mushrooms softens. Add mince. Cook, stirring with wooden spoon to break up mince, for 5 minutes or until browned. Add paste and sauce. Cook stirring, for 1 minute.

- Combine gravy powder and I cup of cold water in a jug. Add to pan. Bring to boil. Cook, stirring, for I to 2 minutes or until sauce thickens. Set aside to cool for I5, minutes.
- Spoon beef mixture into pastry case. Top with puff pastry, trim excess pastry, Press pastry edge with a fork to seal. Brush top with egg. Make 3 small cuts in centre. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes or until golden. Stand for 5 minutes, Serve with mash and peas.

The workers began to weep, the piper began to weep also.


