FROM THE KITCHEN

The menu for each day is displayed on the dining tables. If residents do not wish to have the 'First Choice' for lunch please notify the catering staff that would like the 'Second Choice' shown on the menu. Just in case you do not like either choice offered there are additional alternatives available every day. Lunchtime alternates are - salads, sandwiches, quiche, baked beans and spaghetti. Please advise kitchen staff at breakfast if you would like one of the Lunch alternates rather than what is being offered on the menu for the day.

At tea time there is a selection of two soups, two mains and two sweets on the menu.

tea time alternatives each day are - Salads, raisin toast and sandwiches. Please advise the kitchen prior to 3pm if you would like one of these alternate choices.

So that staff can have your meal ready for you at mealtime please take special note of the times for ordering of alternate meals, therefore at breakfast for lunch and by 3pm for tea.

BUDGET 2018/2019 The Board set the budget for the coming year at its June Meeting. Operationally figures are very tight however it is pleasing to note that Havilah remains one of the 57% of facilities currently operating in surplus (although declining). Labour costs have risen to \$9.2Million an increase of 4.5% on last years budget and 3.4% on last years estimated actual.

Capital Works: \$210,000 has been allowed for general equipment such as floorline beds, lifting and clinical equipment and security. The Board has also made allowance this year for Theatre Room and Virtual Reality Equipment, replacement of floorcoverings and furnishings. Continuation of works at Heath House to replace window furnishings in resident rooms, extend the kitchenettes, screening and floorcoverings in communal areas has been provided for, together with resources to facilitate the opening up of the 1-10 side of the unit. Externally upgrade of external blinds, resurfacing of the driveway and improved parking are all included. The big ticket item this year is installation of solar power at both sites due to rising electricity costs. We have been very fortunate up to now with locked in electricity pricing that has saved us a lot of \$s however that contract has ceased from 30 June. For 18/19 we know the increase will be \$65,000 on the previous year which is a very big hit and power costs are projected to remain at this higher level in the forward years of the budget. The installation estimated to cost around half a million \$'s for both sites will have a pay back period of slightly under 5 years.





In a further very generous gesture Kent Teese and family have donated an Oscar vertical lift chair valued at \$7,500 to be used in Heath House. Kent and daughter Allison attended to present the chair and listen to a presentation by Laurie Smith and CEO Barb Duffin on the many benefits of this new equipment.

WHEN THE FIRE ALARM SOUNDS

Please remain where you are and wait for staff to instruct you on evacuation. If you can see the fire you should move away from the immediate area and wait for instruction from staff. If the fire is in your room you should leave the room and close the door behind you. Havilah is a very safe facility and has many measures in place to stop the spread of fire and smoke and to provide for safe evacuation in the case of a fire – this includes fire and smoke compartments, and sprinklers and smoke alarms.
