We may not be able to do much about the rest of the world, but in our own little part of it, let's try to ensure it's always a welcoming and accepting place to be.



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RESIDENT SURVEYS - October 2015:

Of the 59 (44 Harkness + 15 Raglan) residents surveyed:

98.3% of residents surveyed said they are satisfied with their involvement in decisions about their care or treatment.

81.8% of Harkness street residents said they knew about the fashion parade that was held in September in the main dining room at Harkness Street.

98.3% of residents who attended the fashion parade said they enjoyed it.

88.1% of residents surveyed said they think they are getting enough sleep/rest.



Hi from the desk of the Director of Care,

Summer is upon us and boy is it hot for the first week and they are predicting this heat will continue. This is then a good opportunity to look at our requirements for fluid intake to ensure our residents do not become dehydrated.

There are some common signs of dehydration in the elderly

- Sticky or dry mouth
- Increased thirst
- Fatigue
- Dizziness
- Headache
- Increased confusion

It is recommended that the elderly maintain their fluid intake at approx. I.5 Its per day for an averaged sized person, so remember when visiting your relative or going for outings that we keep in mind the need to drink plenty of water and be aware of the signs for dehydration. I do appear to harp on this issue but it is the simplest thing we can do to maintain good health.






