RESIDENT SURVEY - September 2014

Of the 66 residents surveyed (Harkness = 46 and Raglan = 20)

94% Feel they are given sufficient emotional support in their living environment and 6% feel they either do not have this support or do not want this support.

95.5% Know their families and friends are welcome to join them for a meal and 4.5% said they did not know this.

84% of those using the laundry services find the service adequate. We are hoping that a recent change of chemicals supplied in October will improve satisfaction with the service.

Hi from the desk of the Director of Care, as we are entering spring and the gardens are at their best I encourage family and friends when visiting to please consider a walk around our gardens, enjoying the diverse scenes and colours that abound at this time of the year, plus the weather is near perfect for a stroll in the gardens. We have lots of areas where families can have a picnic style lunch, or just a gathering, please feel free to use our facilities if you require anything special please give our staff plenty of notice and we will do our best to accommodate your requests.

I again reiterate that Havilah is always striving for continuous improvement in all areas and to improve we require input from a variety of sources. We have our continuous improvement / comments and complaints forms available for people to fill in. This helps Havilah recognise areas for improvement as well as evaluating the effectiveness of our actions. This is also an avenue for making recommendations to Havilah for activities that may be appropriate for our residents to participate in, always striving to improve the quality of life and life enjoyment of our residents at Havilah.

An issue that has arisen is "residents in aged care self-administering medications". At Havilah we have a well divined policy for any resident that wishes to self-medicate, from an assessment of the capabilities of the resident to self-administer to possible interactions with other medications. At Havilah we have dedicated medication carers who dispense all residents' medications ensuring the resident receives the appropriate medications; some residents will self-medicate certain medications that have been approved by the GP. We have found that some residents have medications / creams in their rooms without the correct process being followed, these medications / creams have not been provided by Havilah but purchased by the resident or family members. A reminder if family members are asked by the resident to purchase medications / creams that they inform the senior on shift to allow Havilah to follow our processes.

Upgrade WI FI to all areas


Recarpet of resident rooms 1-51

Construction works will be completed by local contractors Lohmann and Bond. Having been involved in the construction of Melaleuca and Correa Houses principals Paul Lohmann and Jamie Bond are well experienced in organising works to achieve the least possible disruption to residents.

During the works there are some areas that will be restricted for the safety of residents and visitors. The main effect will be that parking will be reduced at the front of the building. We will ensure that any disruption is for the least time physically possible. The \$1M project will take about 6 months to complete and will provide significant improvements in the facilities and services we can offer.




